

Judge Sidney M. Aronovitz Memorial Scholarship Fund | Application Guidelines Deadline: Friday, April 14, 2017 at 4 p.m.

History

The Aronovitz Family partnered with The Miami Foundation to honor the memory of the late Judge Sidney M. Aronovitz. Judge Aronovitz stood as an example for the community, excelling in his chosen profession and always thinking of those less fortunate than himself. As an attorney, community leader, and Federal Judge, he demonstrated his dedication to his country and the Greater Miami community. Scholarships are awarded to Miami-Dade County minority students planning to continue their education through the university level and pursue on a career related to the legal field or social justice issues. Award amounts: \$1,000 to \$1,500.

Deadline

Applications must be submitted online by Friday, April 14, 2017 at 4 p.m.

Applicants must submit an application via the Foundation's online grants application portal. To access the online portal, please visit the **Scholarships** page on our website and carefully review the registration instructions.

If an application is missing information, our office will not inform the applicant nor review the application. Mailed, faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted.

Eligibility

In order to qualify, applicants must:

- Plan to pursue a career related to the legal field or social justice issues striving to ensure social fairness and equity in society and working on behalf of marginalized groups.
- Be a minority high school senior or GED student no older than 19 years of age attending a Miami Dade County Public School.
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on 4.0 scale

Selection Criteria

A Scholarship Advisory Committee will review and rate the applications and make final decisions on scholarship awards. The following criteria will be considered in evaluating applicants:

- Career and educational aspirations related to the legal field or advancing social justice
- School and Volunteer Activities/Work Experience and Community Involvement
- Letters of Recommendation
- Academic Achievement
- Financial Need
- Desire to return to Miami-Dade County post-college to better the community

Also tell us if you have any post-college plans to return to Miami and how you plan to benefit the community.
- Letters of Recommendation: Please submit two letters of recommendation: one from a teacher or faculty member and one from a community leader. You will need to upload the two letters as a single PDF document.
- Official Transcript: Please upload an official transcript as a single PDF. Do not send the transcript separately. Downloaded grades from the internet (unofficial transcripts) will not be accepted.
