History

The Ortega Foundation established the Ortega Foundation Scholarship Program in honor of its founder Jose Antonio Ortega, Sr. Jose Antonio believed strongly in giving academically accomplished individuals the opportunity to pursue a college education. Scholarships are awarded to Miami-Dade County high school seniors with a GPA of 3.5 or above. The Ortega Foundation will award up to \$7,000 a year for a four-year scholarship.

Deadline

Applications must be submitted online by **Tuesday, April 30, 2019 at 4 p.m.**

Applicants must submit an application through the Foundation's online grants application portal. To access the online portal, please visit the [Scholarships](#) page on our website and carefully review the registration instructions.

If an application is missing information, our office will not inform the applicant nor review the application. Mailed, faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted.

Eligibility

In order to qualify, applicants must:

- Be a resident of Miami-Dade County
- Be a high school senior graduating in May or June 2019
- Be able to produce documentation that shows your residency status
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.5 (on 4.0 Scale)

Selection Criteria

A Scholarship Advisory Committee will review and rate the applications and make final decisions on scholarship awards. The following criteria will be considered in evaluating applicants:

- Academic Achievement
- Financial Need
- Essay Questions
- Letters of Recommendation
- Video File

Essay Questions:

These questions below will be used to help the selection committee learn who you are and what motivates you. We'd like to get to know you better. Please be honest and authentic with your responses. **There is a 1000 character limit, including spaces, for each question.**

1. School and Volunteer Activities: Please list in chronological order the extracurricular activities you have been involved in while attending high school. Leave a line space between each activity.
2. Work Experience: Please list in chronological order any work experience you have had while attending high school. Leave a line space between each job position. If this does not apply to you put "Not Applicable."
3. Imagine that you are the director of admissions at a selective college and you had to choose one student from a pool of very qualified applicants. Aside from excellent academics, what other qualities would be important in making your decision? Why?
4. Presuming there was only one scholarship remaining, why should this committee choose to accept your scholarship application and not that of another student?
5. If you had the opportunity to bring any person — past or present, fictional or nonfictional — to your hometown, who would you bring and why? Tell us what you would share with that person.

Other Required Attachments to be uploaded online along with the application:

- **Letters of Recommendation:** Please submit **at least one** letter of recommendation. Upload as a single PDF document. The letters should speak to your academic achievements and primary strengths.
- **Official Transcript:** Please upload an official transcript as a single PDF. Do not send the transcript separately. Downloaded grades from the internet and unofficial transcripts will not be accepted.

Personal Video to Email separately (do not submit online)

- Create a one-minute video introducing yourself to your future college classmates or roommate. Be as authentic as possible. Once completed, e-mail your video file or link to arosales@miamifoundation.org with the subject line "Ortega Scholarship 2019 Video".
