



2023 Liberty Square/Lincoln Gardens Student Scholarship Fund | Application Guidelines

Deadline: Friday, April 28th at 4 p.m.

Notification of Award: Thursday, June 1st

Annual Award Amount: Up to \$2,000 (eligible applicants can reapply yearly)

History

The Related Group established the fund in 2018 to reflect its broad commitment to revitalizing Liberty Square, built in 1937 and one of the nation's oldest public housing projects. As lead developer for the Liberty Square Rising redevelopment and Lincoln Gardens residential community, the company seeks to transform the homes and community for hundreds of residents. The scholarship fund will enable students with high aspirations who live, or whose immediate family lives in Liberty Square and Lincoln Gardens to pursue their future goals by supporting their post-secondary education.

Submission + Deadline

- Applicants must submit an application through the Miami Foundation's online grants application portal. To access the online portal, please visit miamifoundation.org/scholarships carefully review the registration instructions.
- If an application is missing information, The Foundation will **not** inform the applicant nor review the application. Mailed, faxed or emailed applications **will not** be accepted.
- Applications must be submitted online by **Friday, April 28th at 4 p.m.**

Eligibility

In order to qualify, applicants must:

- Currently or previously resided in or have a parent or guardian who resides in Liberty Square or Lincoln Gardens
- Demonstrate high aspirations, perseverance and service to the community
- Fit one of the following categories:
 - a) A high school senior graduating in 2023 who plans to pursue a college degree and has at least a 2.5 GPA
 - b) A high school senior on track to earn your high school diploma or GED in 2023 who plans to pursue a career-path vocational certification program
 - c) A high school graduate planning to pursue a college degree and has at least a 2.5 GPA
 - d) A high school graduate planning to pursue or already enrolled in a career-path vocational certification program and have a 2.0 GPA

Selection Criteria

A Scholarship Advisory Committee will review and rate the applications and make final decisions on scholarship awards. The following criteria will be considered in evaluating applicants:

- Essay Questions
- Academic Performance
- Financial Need
- Letter of Recommendation

Essay Questions:

These questions will help the selection committee learn who you are, your aspirations and what motivates you. Please be authentic with your responses. There is a 1,000 character limit, including spaces, for each question.

- Your Story:** Tell us about the family and Liberty Square/Lincoln Garden community you come from, what makes them unique and how they have shaped your life.
- Aspirations:** Tell us about your future aspirations in terms of the kind of career and life you want to have and the type of person you want to be. What obstacles stand in your way?
- Perseverance:** Tell us about a challenge you faced to achieving a goal important to you. What did you learn to help you overcome future obstacles and achieve your goals?
- Community Service:** Share an example of how you have given back to your community that is particularly meaningful to you.

Other Required Attachments to be uploaded online along with the application:

- Letter of Recommendation (1):** Please submit **one** letter of recommendation from a teacher, community leader, or advisor. Upload as a single PDF document. The letter(s) should speak to your character and primary strengths.
- Unofficial Transcript:** Please upload an unofficial transcript as a single PDF. Do not send the transcript separately.
